



2020 Annual Meeting Excursions

Unlike Charles Wesley, many people regard St. Simons Island as a "cool" place to visit, year-round, but the island does heat up in the summertime. Planners considered the summer heat for the August 2020 meeting when they included two bus tours: one half-day tour to Fort Frederica National Park and other sites on the island; the other tour, a full day for Methodist sites and buffet lunch at *The Pirates' House* in Savannah.

Because of the distances and availability of parking, car-pooling would introduce problems for drivers. A comfortable, AIR-CONDITIONED bus will make the tours far more enjoyable for everyone. But busses and meals at nice restaurants are expensive; planning for an uncertain number made including the cost necessary and increased the proposed registration fee significantly as presented to the Executive Committee November 7.

The Executive Committee has therefore supplemented support from available funds to reduce the registration fee to a normal level. **All registrants will be welcome to join the tours and share in the meal at no additional cost.**

The Savannah trip will include some program discussion during the two-hour drives to and from Savannah. An interesting bonus: a part of *The Pirates' House* served as living quarters and work shed for the gardener in the colonial Trustees Garden. The oldest part of the building is the only structure in modern Savannah known to John and Charles Wesley.
